



# Call for Late-Breaking Scientific Abstracts

Abstracts must be received by  
Friday, December 17, 2004.

## General Information

All investigators in the field of clinical pharmacology and therapeutics – members, nonmembers and trainees – are invited to submit abstracts to be considered for presentation.

**Abstracts must describe original, previously unpublished work, and be ground-breaking, innovative, and have a high impact factor in the areas of drug discovery, development, regulation and utilization.**

All late-breaking abstracts accepted by the Scientific Program Committee will be presented as posters at the 2005 ASCPT Annual Meeting.

The cost to submit an abstract is **\$35 USD** for ASCPT members and **\$50 USD** for non-members.

*The author(s) grant(s) permission to the American Society for Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics (ASCPT) to duplicate the abstract that is to be presented as part of the 2005 ASCPT Annual Meeting. ASCPT has the right to record any presentation made in any and all formats. Copies of all abstracts will be published in the February issue of ASCPT's journal, Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics, and distributed to registrants during the meeting.*

## Instructions

**Please follow carefully – failure to comply with the below-outlined guidelines will result in your abstract being eliminated from consideration for presentation at the 2005 ASCPT Annual Meeting.**

- 1. Abstracts must describe original, previously unpublished work.** Work that has been published previously as a full paper cannot be submitted as an abstract. Data that have been presented, **in part**, at other scientific meetings **may** be submitted. However, abstracts that are identical or substantially similar to abstracts submitted to other meetings and will be published elsewhere **cannot** be submitted. When submitting work that has been presented elsewhere, please e-mail a copy of that abstract to [howie@ascpt.org](mailto:howie@ascpt.org), and reference the current submission to which it corresponds.
- 2. Select one scientific section** that most closely corresponds to the scientific content of the abstract.
- 3. All authors are required to disclose potential conflicts of interest.** Examples of such conflicts include commercial sponsorship of research, acceptance of honoraria or consulting fees, and significant stock holdings in a company connected to the research.
- 4. Abstracts must include the following four (4) headers:**

- **Background/Aims** – state the research objective and the importance of the study being conducted.
- **Methods** – this section should include information study design, setting, participants, and intervention
- **Results** – present the main outcomes of the study including confidence intervals and P values. Provide absolute values and risk differences so that absolute and relative impact of the results can be determined.
- **Conclusions** – state the conclusions that are directly supported by the evidence and the implications of the findings.

These headers **must** appear in the body of your abstract, and must be in **bold** and **all caps**.

**5. Copyright, duplications and distribution permission.** The primary author, on behalf of all authors, transfers copyright of the accepted abstract to ASCPT, as well as the right to record, in any or all media, any presentations made and/or published at the Annual Meeting or in association with the Annual Meeting.

**Other guidelines to keep in mind:**

- All drugs must be identified by generic or chemical names. **Trade names are not acceptable.**
- The title of the abstract must be in all caps.
- The list of authors, institutions, and locations must immediately follow the abstract title.
- The name and degree of the first author must be underlined.
- The body of the abstract should begin on a new indented line.
- **Abstracts must be less than 1300 characters, NOT including spaces.** This limit **ONLY** applies to the **BODY** of the abstract – **NOT** the title or author information.
